

COURSE OFFERINGS



ART EXPLORATION

*Note: Art Explorations is a prerequisite for all art department courses, with the exception of Art History.

Course: Art Explorations

Grade: 9-12

Length of Course: Two Semesters

Students are introduced to a wide range of materials, methods, and experiences and learn the elements of art and principles of design.

This foundation course is the basis for the advanced level art courses.

Each unit of study includes lab work, art history when pertinent, class discussions and critiques of completed work. Units include drawing, collage, printmaking, painting, ceramics, and sculpture.

ART HISTORY

Course: Art History

Grade: 9-12

Length of Course: One Semester

Art History students study the history of art in the western world from the Stone Age to contemporary art. A textbook, slides, and videos are used along with lectures, discussions, and student projects. The course is geared to all students and is strongly recommended for those interested in art or an art-related career.

DRAWING 1

Course: Drawing 1

Grade: 10-12

Prerequisite: Art Explorations

Length of Course: One Semester

Student drawing activities develop a better understanding of art elements and design principles and aids in the development and improvement of drawing abilities and the exploration of techniques.

SCULPTURE & DESIGN

Course: Sculpture and Design

Grade: 10-12

Prerequisite: Art Explorations

Length of Course: One Semester

Students apply the art elements and principles of design through making two and three-dimensional works. Students design and construct 2D and 3D projects using a variety of materials including paper, paint, ink, wood, clay, metals, fibers, et al.

CERANICS 1

Course: Ceramics 1

Grade: 10-12

Prerequisite: Art Explorations

Length of Course: One Semester

Ceramics students make hand-built pieces and learn to use the potter's wheel. Various methods of decorating and firing clay are experienced.

PRINTMAKING

Course: Printmaking

Grade: 10-12

Prerequisite: Art Explorations

Length of Course: One Semester

students work in a variety of printmaking methods, including silk-screen, lithography, linoleum cuts and/or woodcuts, intaglio, xerography, and mono prints.

PAINTING 1

Course: Painting 1

Grade: 10-12

Prerequisite: Art Explorations

Length of Course: One Semester

Painting students use acrylics, watercolors, tempera, and other media to develop and increase their understanding of color and composition. Traditional and contemporary methods are explored.

ADVANCED COURSES

The following level 2 courses are designed for advanced students. Work in each course builds upon previous art experiences in level 1 classes. Greater levels of creative thinking and higher degrees of technical skills are expected for the class work. Students must be self-motivated and self-disciplined and exert greater dedication to their art. Research projects may be required.

Must have a minimum grade of "C" in the previous art course.
